KEY OUTCOMES

Largest and most inclusive UNCCD COP



- > 24,000 registered participants in the Blue Zone
- > **33,000** registered in the Green Zone
- 176 Parties represented
- 580 side-events
- **141** High-Level segment participants
- **3,500** Civil Society Organizations representatives
- > 400 private sector representatives from finance, fashion, agri-food, and pharma sectors







39 Key Decisions

- First decision on sustainable rangeland management
- First decision on **agricultural lands**
- Decision on Post 2030 Process: IWG on the Future Strategic Framework of the Convention
- Synergies with other Rio
 Conventions across various decisions
- Approval of the UNCCD budget and programme of work for 2025-2026





Financial Commitments

- Riyadh Global Drought Resilience Partnership
 - Mobilized **USD 2.15 billion** to support drought resilience
- Drought Resilience and Land restoration
 - Mobilized USD 10 billion to support Drought Resilience and Land restoration efforts
- Great Green Wall Accelerator
 - Mobilized **USD 14.6 million** to strengthen coordination and implementation across 22 countries
- Vision for Adapted Crops and Soils (VACS)
 - Mobilized USD 70 million for resilient food systems
- Saudi Green Initiative
 - Mobilized USD 60 million for climate and environmental efforts





Inclusion and Representation

Empowering Communities

- First Indigenous Peoples' Forum at UNCCD COP, as well as Gender Caucus and Youth Forum
- Landmark creation of Indigenous Peoples' and Local Communities' Caucuses
- Largest-ever youth participation; focus on youth-led initiatives e.g. Land Heroes
- Endorsement of the Youth Engagement Strategy
- Emphasis on addressing gender discrimination in land policies





Engaging the Private Sector




- **Business4Land** Initiative and Call to Action launched to increase private sector investment in land restoration and resilience
- Largest private sector participation in UNCCD COP history
- Collaboration across finance, fashion, agrifood, and pharmaceuticals sectors
- Emphasis on **innovative financing models** and advocacy for sustainable practices
- Aims to close the gap in funding for combating land degradation, currently only 6% of investments




