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PROPOSED MONITORING AND REPORTING TEMPLATES ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF MAP PROGRAMMES OF WORK

Introduction

The Secretariat has prepared the present document to initiate the process on how to effectively monitor and report on the implementation of the biannual programme of work in conjunction with the 5-year programme of work.

The Governance paper in its chapter 7, outlines modalities on how to assess progress in the implementation of the programme of work that is considered one of the pillars of progress monitoring in MAP, together with state of environment reporting and legislative/institutional progress in Contracting Parties.

The Governance paper provides also that reporting from different MAP components should include associated cost-benefit analysis, impact of activities and their effectiveness as well as efforts made to mobilize external resources.

Within MAP, monitoring and reporting are carried out for political, programmatic and financial purposes, thus involving different reporting timeline, requirements and bodies. As such, there is a need for a consolidated monitoring and reporting framework that should avoid any overlapping and duplication of efforts to the extent possible.

In view of implementing the requirements of the Governance paper with regard to monitoring and reporting on the implementation of the programme of work, the Secretariat has prepared three monitoring templates for discussion and agreement as appropriate.

Template 1: Six-month monitoring reporting plan

The six-month Monitoring and Reporting Plan is based on the joint MAP work plan. The shaded columns, used previously in the workplan to show for the timing of activities, are kept in the reporting template in order to be filled every six months with information on the status of implementation and achievements if any. The shading is also left for indicative purposes to facilitate consistency between planning and implementation cycle. There is one additional column called *remarks* under which the components should highlight convergence of divergence from goals, obstacles, successes and if need be, precise technical details. The last column should indicate the percentage of budget spent for each output. This template is fully in line with the 6-month progress report to be prepared by MAP components REMPEC, Blue Plan, PAP/RAC, SPA/RAC, WHO/MED POL in the framework of UNEP project documents. However, the Coordinating Unit will make a special effort, as appropriate, to align time wise to the extent possible, the reporting for the Bureau and MAP Focal Points meetings with the respective UNEP project documents. There is also a need to ensure alignment, as appropriate, for CP/RAC and INFO/RAC project documents as per their respective national reporting requirements.

Template 2: Annual monitoring and reporting plan

Monitoring and Reporting based on performance and achievement indicators is one of the most important elements of MAP Programme of work. However, there are a number of issues that need some discussion and common approach with regard to indicators and targets:

- a) Concrete achievements and quantified targets per theme are not available in both 5year and 2-year programmes of work. Definition of major achievements and targets is key to enable measuring of progress achieved over time.
- b) Many indicators agreed in the 5-year and 2-year programmes of work are performance and not outcome oriented and mainly developed at activity level.

Baseline values and targets should be discussed and established jointly at a later stage at the level of achievement and for the group of related activities;

- c) There is a need to link budgetary allocations on activities with outputs, major achievements and outcomes so as to be in a position to analyse cost effectiveness of the implementation of the Programme of work. This could be done by tracking and reporting to administration, from the inception phase, the designation of funds required to carry out activities for specific outputs.
- d) There is also a need to link staff time allocation with specific outputs.

With the view to ensure a quantifiable progress monitoring and reporting under the lines described above, a template is proposed for each of the 6 themes separately that contains elements with regard to baseline and targets, means of verification, staff time allocated per each output, results/impact and budget spent. This task should be completed by MAP components at the end of the year.

Template 3: Integrated biannual monitoring reporting plan in conjunction with the 5year programme of work

The objective of this biannual monitoring reporting plan is to assess per each theme the contribution of the results/outcome of the implementation of the biannual programme of work to the achievements of the targets of the 5-year programme of work.

This table will be compiled by the Coordinating Unit on the basis of Table II on an annual and biannual basis.

Definition of terms used

Outcome:

Synonym: Immediate Objective The publicly stated objective of a development programme or project

Output:

Synonym: Intermediate Objective; results (EU)

The products, capital goods and services which result from a programme/project; may also include changes resulting from the intervention which lead to the achievement of the outcomes.

Activity:

Action taken or work performed through which inputs, such as funds, technical assistance and other types of resources are mobilized to produce specific outputs.

Achievement/Accomplishment:

Achievement/Accomplishment is the direct consequence or effect of the generation of outputs and lead to the attainment of a certain objective.

Indicators of achievement:

Used to measure whether objectives or expected accomplishments have been achieved and, if so, to what extent. Indicators correspond either directly or indirectly to the objective or the expected accomplishment in respect of which they are used to measure performance.

Target:

A fixed goal or objective.

Baseline/Benchmark:

Reference point or standard against which performance or achievements can be assessed.
